To guarantee the public's right to access information.




VISION

MISSION



OVERVIEW OF 2019 ACTIVITIES

Governments agencies and relevant private entities are taking up the challenge of opening up to the public, out the recognition that enlightenment ideas of a public right to scrutinise how power is being exercised in a democratic governance system. This can be attributed to the amount and quality of time for training and awareness carried out.

The Right To Information Unit has this year focused on the training of Right To Information Officers throughout the country. We were also heavily involved in developing educational resource for officials and the public.

Most of the 2019 RTI activities were made possible through a UNDP-PRAC Capacity Building allocation of VT2, 081,461. Bulk of the fund was used to conduct six trainings involving 94 nominated RTI officers from government and relevant private entities, in Port Vila, Luganville and the outer provinces. The trips to the provinces to conduct trainings also provided opportunities for community engagement with civil society to promote the use and understanding of the Act.

Senior Vanuatu Government officials have been presented this new RTI concept and were told that the success of the RTI implementation depends on a change in the mindset on how government information is perceived. Nevertheless, the difficulty to formalising positions for designated RTI Officers provides empirical evidence that the impact of the law remains scarce.

On the onset, improvements in RTI system only makes a difference if people can freely make use of the RTI law and if they can use the information they obtained to benefit them, including sharing it in public.



RECORDS MANAGEMENT

Several events happened in 2019 that highlighted the importance and the benefits of good record-keeping, we provided basic record-keeping workshops and training's along with the Right To Information Officers Training's in the 6 provinces of Vanuatu and we completed and published the Government Code of Practice on Records and Information Management fulfilling Section 72 of the Right to Information Act No 13 of 2016.

Furthermore, the RTI Unit collaborated with the National Archives to publish a brochure on Records and Information Management that promotes the benefit of keeping proper records and following the launch of the National Policy on Records and Information Management in 2018 this year the RTI Unit with partnership from the National Archives has conducted a Basic File Management Training with the Ministry of the Prime Minister to ensure the Ministry's compliance with this National Policy.

We acknowledge the continued support of the National Archives in collaborating with the RTI Unit in delivering Basic File Management Training in the Government and supporting the RTI Unit's activities.

The effective management of the Government's information allows government to create, find, use and re-use information for as long as it is required, ensuring those records of government business with permanent value are identified and preserved as Government archives for the benefit of the people of Vanuatu both now and in the future. Effective records management also allows efficient access to information in government through the Right to Information Act.

PROACTIVE PUBLICATION



The practice of delivering information to the public domain is a requirement under the Right To Information Act which obligates government agencies to do more proactive publication of their activities, news, plans and other categories of information outlined under Section 6 of the RTI Act.

This year we run an assessment of over 30 government-run websites to establish a baseline in order to identify what we can do to strengthen and improve government websites to the standard that is required by the RTI Act.

Our assessment identified that the combined government websites were 78% away from abiding with Section 6 of the RTI Act, which means that moving forward into 2020 we should be encouraging and supporting the administrators of these websites to achieve a higher score in the next website assessment.


RTI OFFICERS MONTHLY REPORT

Officers who were nominated by their agencies to attend the Right To Information Workshop were tasked with submitting a monthly report on the frequency and the nature of information requests from the public to their agencies.

In this report we can confirm that out of all 75 government agencies that are under the enforcement orders of the RTI Act only three submitted their RTI Monthly Reports to the Right To Information Unit, however they did not submit their monthly report on every month of 2019.

The graph shows that **900** RTI monthly reports are expected to be received by the Right To Information Unit every year, in 2019 only **9** RTI monthly reports were received thus making a low **0.01%** score out of a hundred percent.


BUDGET Appropriated by Parliament

In 2019 the Right To Information Unit was allocated a budget of 9,649,585 VT by the Parliament of Vanuatu.

7,481,761 Vatu 78.61% of the RTI Unit 2019 budget was allocated as Salary.

22.39% of the RTI Unit 2019 budget was allocated to fund operations or activities.


